Holy Week at Home kits!!!!

On Saturday morning (4/4) from 10 to noon, volunteers will be distributing "Holy Week at Home" kits! We will have enough for every household of St. Martin's. Included in the kits will be various items and instructions for doing your own worship at home, whether it's just yourself or with other household members. These kits are being put together and distributed under strict hygiene standards.

We have two options to collect your kit, either in-person or (with pre-arrangement) via delivery to your home.

For in-person pickup, please come to the church parking lot anytime from 10:00 through noon on Saturday morning. We will have four different distribution stations spread out around the parking lot with a gloved volunteer at each station. Please drive up to an empty station, indicate with your fingers through your closed window how many are in your household (so we can ensure you get the right number of items), pop your trunk, and the volunteer will place the kit in your trunk and close it. Do not exit your car!

For delivery, please contact Pastor Maggie at pastormaggie@stmartinssp.org or by phone/text at 608-515-8618. We will drop off the kit for you outside your front door.

Note from Pastor Maggie

Grace and Peace to you, my beloved siblings in Christ!

It's hard to believe that it was only a month ago that I last wrote to you as we welcomed in the season of Lent. You may have seen the joke going around on social media that says "I meant to give up things for Lent, but I didn't mean to give up this much!" (Forgive me. Humor is my go-to coping mechanism in times of stress!)

What a strange and disconcerting world we find ourselves in now. In just a short time, it feels like everything we know has changed. Coronavirus has disrupted our lives in ways we couldn't have even imagined, and the repercussions continue to ripple every day. No doubt we will still be healing months, perhaps years from now, long after spread of the virus is contained.

Was this uncertainty what it was like for Jesus when he fasted for 40 days in the wilderness and

endured the Devil's temptations? Was this something of what the Israelites felt when they wandered through the desert with Moses in search of the Promised Land? Or how about Noah stranded on the ark with the beasts of the land? In some ways, maybe. Was God there with God's people throughout those times of trial? Did God's promise remain? Yes, most certainly. Is God with us here? Definitely.

Without a doubt, we will be changed by this experience. But the joy that we can take from this is that we have a choice in how we will be changed. We can use this as an opportunity to awaken our sense of empathy for our neighbors. We can find ways to reconnect. We can strengthen our spiritual practices. We can emerge from the isolation, from the wilderness, with a new understanding of what it means to be Church.

We will have a kit available for every family which we will distribute in the church parking lot at a safe CDC-compliant distance. Ways to continue Giving

Here are some ways you can continue your support

-- Try the old tried and true method - *snail mail!* That's right, mail your check in! (2427 Church St., Cross Plains, 53528)

- Drop off your contribution by using the locked box by the office door. No need to come in contact with anyone and it gets you out of the house for a few minutes. Someone will check this box daily.
- Contact your bank and ask them to help you with online banking. Most banks will send out a check as you direct them to. Most will even pay for the stamp!
- Try Give Plus. Yes, there's an App for that and it's FREE. Easy to use prompts help you get set up easily, quickly. There's no fee to you and a small fee to the church.
- Paypal -- We have PayPal set up on our website. You do not have to have PayPal account of your own.
- Direct Deposit. Many of you already use this method. If you wish to set this up, contact our bookkeeper, Lois Weiland, by calling 608-220-3123.

Canstruction event CANCELLED

The Missions Team announces Canstruction, our focus on ending local hunger during the Lenten season by building a St. Martin's structure out of cans, has been **cancelled** due to COVID-19.

While Canstruction has been cancelled, hunger has not, it has in fact been accelerated during the pandemic due to businesses closings and layoff increases. While the MOM food pantry has been closed, a drive through pantry with pre-packed food boxes has been established to continue to meet the needs of our neighbors.

Please Note: MOM is NOT accepting food or clothing donations at this time.

They are working closely with Second Harvest and the rapidly changing recommendations for food safety and distribution. Financial donations, however, are gratefully accepted. You can make your check payable to St. Martin's (no cash, please) with MOM indicated on the memo line and place in the lock box located outside the church office door until services are rescheduled. We will make a single donation to MOM from all donations received. Once church resumes, you can bring your donation to the Mission table. *Thank you!*
