UPDATE ABOUT RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

Greetings, members of St. Martin's family! I know that we are all anxiously awaiting a return to "normal" (whatever that means!) and resuming in-person worship. Unfortunately, current COVID-19 transmission levels in our area prevent that from being a safe option at this time. Taking into account current advisements from the synod, the Wisconsin Council of Churches, and the Dane County Public Health Dept., we have made the decision to continue worshipping online through the month of September. We continue to monitor this rapidly changing situation closely and we will be making worshipping decisions on a month-to-month basis. I know it would be easier to have more clarity and a long-term plan, but the nature of this disease prevents that from being a realistic goal.

However, we are very excited to announce our plan to move our online worship from Facebook Live to Zoom! This will allow us to interact with each other and actively participate in worship. Since Zoom allows for people to call in on a telephone as well, this also extends worship to our members who are not online.

We will be having our **first Zoom worship service on September 6th at 9 AM**. Since this is also the first Sunday of the month, that means we will also be celebrating the feast of Holy Communion together, so please remember to have some communion elements handy at that time! We will be providing Zoom access information for both online and phone closer to the date via a private, separate communication. This link will not be posted on our FB page or website to prevent hacking/"Zoom-bombing." This doesn't mean that you can't share the link with others you think might be interested in joining us—all are certainly welcome!—we are just taking extra precautions to make sure this is a safe and enjoyable experience for all. A recording of our worship will be posted later to YouTube and Facebook for those who are unable to join us for the live service on Zoom.

Please also mark your calendars for another **Online Coffee with Council immediately following the worship service on September 6th**. Topics will include church finances and worship. We want to have your input, so please plan on attending this important meeting.

We look forward to seeing you and hearing your voices starting September 6th! Please continue to join us online as we gather in one body united by the Holy Spirit across the distance to offer our praise and prayers to God, our source of strength and comfort, in these difficult times.

Second Quarter Financial Status Report

As of June, 2020

Giving has fallen off sharply in the past two months. YTD Service Receipts were \$134,277.20 which is below our YTD budget of \$ 154,218.00. June Service Receipts were \$13,050.33 which is below our monthly budget of \$22,830.75

We started the year in good shape thanks to our year-end drive to eliminate the line of credit loan. We also received a 17,000 PPP Loan that we hope will be forgiven. However, our June total income was \$7,990.55 short of expenses for the month. If this continues we will run out of operating funds in less than 3 months.

We understand that these are challenging times; unfortunately most of our expenses continue (mortgage, salaries, Synod etc.). Please continue to support us to the best of your ability during this time.

Virtual Film Screening & Facilitated Discussion

13th: From Slave to Criminal in One Amendment

August 13th, 20th & 27th (from 7p to 8:30p)

Presented by Aspiring Anti-Racists of Cross Plains in partnership with the Rosemary Garfoot Public Library.

Register early, limited space available!

The historical roots of African American oppression run deep, as Ava DuVernay's documentary **13th** reveals. The film looks back to the ratification of Amendment XIII, which states, "*Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction.*" DuVernay argues that a prison-industrial complex which statistically imprisons black men disproportionately and allows for their disciplinary servitude, has taken advantage of America's black population and brings into question if this system ultimately acts as a form of modern day slavery.

Facilitated by [Roderick "Rudy" Bankston](#), we'll meet virtually to view and discuss the film **13th**. Over three, 1½ hour sessions, we'll reflect on the legacy of slavery, the politics of mass incarceration, the representation of African Americans, and the stigma of being Black.

Funding provided by the Rosemary Garfoot Public Library and a Dane County Libraries Beyond the Page Grant with Support from the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Madison Community Foundation.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY UPDATE

After several postponements due to the pandemic, the annual synod assembly will be meeting on Saturday, August 29th. This will be an entirely online meeting and, unlike previous years, the meeting will only be open to voting representatives due to constraints of the online forum.
